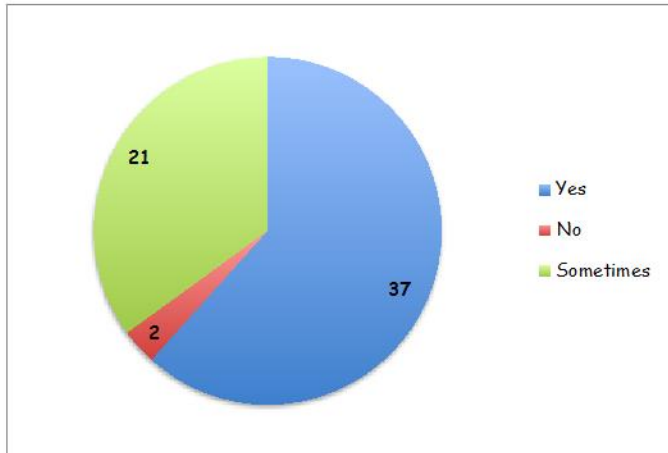


Pupil Questionnaire Responses: February 2015

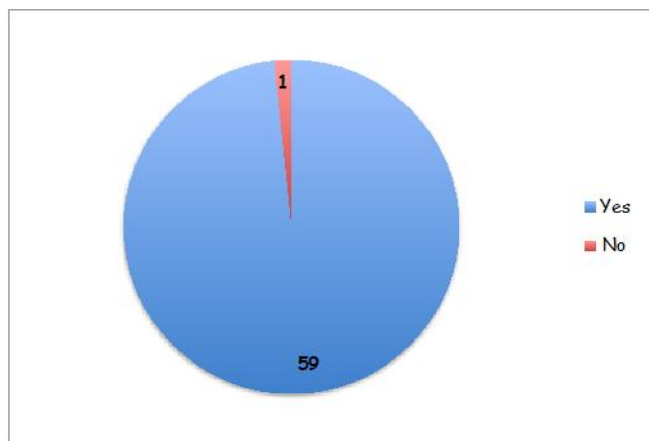
