## Main Barriers identified:

- Gaps in learning, knowledge and skills, which are identified through standardised assessments, screening tests and teacher observations.
- In some cases, low levels of attendance or changes in schools have resulted in gaps in knowledge which need to be addressed.
- Evidence of some emotional and behavioural difficulties, which need additional support.
- Limited access to enriched activities, access to sports and clubs and visits due to low income of parents.

## How will we measure the impact and effect of Pupil Premium funding?

- Teacher assessments and standardised testing will measure the impact of educational interventions and support, which are reviewed at half termly Pupil progress Meetings.
- Initiatives to encourage better attendance, such as breakfast club, arranging bus transport, which will be monitored through weekly attendance checks and joint working with the Educational Welfare Officer.
- Pastoral support systems will monitor the impact of a weekly Nurture Club, termly Mental Health and Wellbeing Days, training of TA's and teachers through Thurston Community College, as well as activities which support pupils' social and emotional needs.
