Lime Class

History/Geography

Mini History Topic: I'm Special, I'm Me!

What is history? Gaining historical perspective by sequencing events from our own lives onto personal history timelines. Matching objects to people of different ages. Recognise the difference between past and present in their own lives.

Topic: Harvest - Local walk around Cockfield

What is geography? Investigating local geography and using basic geographical vocabulary to refer to: Key physical and human features.

2nd Half term:

Topic: Celebrations Around the World

Naming, locating and identifying characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas.

Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries.

Music

Learning how to find the pulse and use our voices.

1st half term - Me!

2nd half term - Everyone!

Computing

We are TV Chefs- learning how to record videos, linked to our DT cooking project.

We are Illustrators- Using drawing programmes to create pictures and illustrations.

PE

Dance - using a story to move through the space confidently and begin to create sequences of movement.

Games - key skills including throwing, rolling and aiming

Reception will also have balance bikes for 5 weeks.

Literacy

Reception will be focusing on writing their names, being able to name the letters in their name and ensuring they form each letter correctly. There will also be a focus on speaking in full sentences, listening to stories and predicting how they might end.

Year 1 will be using our class texts to learn about the components that make a good sentence. We will focus heavily on letter formation, including capital letters, and segmenting for spelling.

Phonics

Reception - Listening skills and activities until appropriate to begin the Storytime Phonics programme.

Year 1 - Revision of sounds and tricky words learnt so far before learning new graphemes.

Maths

Reception will have a number of the week which will influence continuous provision activities. We will also focus on 1:1 counting, number formation and ordering numbers to ten.

Year 1 will be comparing and ordering numbers, identifying and completing patterns and solving addition and subtraction problems with numbers to 10. After half term, we will identify, name and describe 2-D and 3-D shapes before moving on to numbers to 20.

Science

Seasonal Change

- Observing changes across the four seasons
- Observing and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.

Materials

- Distinguishing between an object and the material from which it is made.
- Identifying and naming a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, water and rock.
- Describing the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials.
- Comparing and grouping together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their physical properties.

Art/DT

In DT we will design, make and evaluate a healthy food product and record the process in our computing lessons.

In art this term we will focus on drawing and printmaking. We will experiment with mark making and develop skills in colour, texture and shape. Our focus artists will be Andy Goldsworthy and Jasper Johns.

RE - Belonging

We will look at belonging in Christianity and Judaism

- Why is belonging to God and the church family important to Christians?
- Why is learning to do good deeds so important to Jewish people?

PSHE

Friendships and relationships - My feelings, my body and my relationships.
