| | <p>Persuasive writing</p> <p>This week our persuasive writing will be focusing on writing a speech. Having looked at climates around the world and deforestation last week, we will be basing our speech on global warming and climate change. Watch this clip of her famous speech at the Climate Action Summit in 2019: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=KAJsdgTPJpU</p> <p>Did you notice how she directed her speech at the world leaders? She was very emotional too during the speech and used emotive vocabulary which was repeated throughout – can you spot what phrase she repeated?</p> <p>TASKS:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Look at the features of speech writing worksheet 1 and 2. Cut out the cards and re-arrange them so that they are in the correct order and the device, description and example all match (at the moment they are all jumbled up). Stick them on the worksheet.2. Plan your speech about global warming – what point do you want to get across? What facts back up your argument? Who needs to act on this in order to protect our world for future generations? Use the Climate Change PowerPoint and planning sheet to guide your thinking. (I have included the ‘My ideas to tackle global warming’ worksheet if you wish to use it to help you.)3. Write your own speech about global warming. |

| Geography | <p>The world's longest mountain range – the Andes</p>  <p>*Use the picture cards to answer the questions on the Andes worksheet.</p> <p>*Cut out the mountain template. Write information (use the items listed on the little card to guide you) to create a 'mountain of information' about the Andes! You could write the facts in different colours, add flaps if you like to reveal your answers – make your fact mountain as exciting as you wish! Once you have written all the information, fold it and stick it together to create a 3D mountain full of interesting facts. Remember to bring this into school when we return so that we can put them on display.</p> |
