Reading	<p>Practice a random selection of your Phonic Fairy sounds and Tricky Troll words.</p> <p>Daily reading of your reading book or another book from home. 😊</p>	<p>Look at the picture below. Use the thinking stems: I'm seeing I'm wondering I'm feeling I'm noticing I'm thinking</p> <p>to talk about the picture with someone at home. As an extra challenge, you could write one of your ideas down. Writing	<p>Practise forming the letters in your name with a capital letter that is bigger than your lowercase letters and entry lines on your lower case letters.</p>	<p>What can you see at the park? Look at the picture and write down what you can see. Use your Phonic Fairy fingers to count the sounds that you can hear and write them down. Make sure you form your letters correctly, with entry lines. I have put some sound mats in to help you. For an extra challenge, try to write in full sentences.</p> <p><i>*Parents - the children wont necessarily spell the words correctly but what is important is that they use their phonics to segment the sounds they can hear. For example, they might write 'apple' as 'a-p-l' as those are the sounds they can hear. They may spell 'birds' as 'b-er-d-s' because they have learnt the 'er' spelling. Encourage them to use their sound mats to find the sound they need. 😊</i></p>	<p>What is your favourite colour? Can you find things at home that are that colour and make a list of them?</p>
Maths	<p>Practise counting forwards and backwards within 20. Start at 0 and count forwards or start at 20 and count backwards. You will need: a balloon and your body parts. Don't let the balloon touch the floor! You can use any of your body parts to tap the balloon back up into the air - hand, arm, leg,</p>

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	<p>objects, make sure you are only saying one number name for each object.</p>	<p>For this game you will need a large container, such as a bucket, a small ball or bean bag and something to mark out the spot where you will stand. Stand on your spot and throw the ball into the bucket by aiming carefully. How are you going to keep your score? You could collect something small, like a coin or piece of Lego, each time you get the ball in the bucket. What will you score when you miss the bucket? Count your points at the end.
