

Literacy

Fiction

We will be reading the story of Jack and the Beanstalk and comparing different versions. Using this as inspiration to write our own stories. Year 1 will be exploring new and ambitious vocabulary to make our writing interesting. We will focus on letter formation, correct punctuation, spelling and grammar when writing. Reception will be focusing on writing captions and sentences using our phonics and tricky word knowledge. In the second half of the term, we will create dinosaur adventure stories.

Non-fiction

As part of our science topic, we will explore a range of non-fiction books about plants. We will write instructions on how to plant seeds. Reception will be focusing on writing captions using their phonic knowledge. In the second half of the summer term, we will be writing letters and postcards inspired by our class book. We will research and write facts about dinosaurs.

To help your child at home you can read with them 5 or more times a week and ask questions about the characters and main events in their book, play games such as I spy using sounds and letter names, practise tricky words in the back of their reading record and encourage them to write for a range of purposes including letters, shopping lists and stories.

Maths

Reception will be representing numbers to 20 and counting in patterns beyond 10. They will continue to practically solve addition and subtraction problems, as well as exploring 2D shapes. We will then move on to sharing and grouping numbers using objects.

Year 1 children we will be comparing and ordering numbers to 100. We will also be focusing on repeated addition (multiplication) and sharing into equal groups (division). In the second half of the summer term, we will be finding a half and a quarter of shapes and quantities. We will continue to practise telling the time and learn the names and values of coins and notes.

Mathematical fluency, problem solving, reasoning, recall and application of knowledge

At home you could count objects, count in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s, recognise and write numerals, add and take away amounts using objects and practise telling the time (o'clock and half past).

Music

We will be listening and responding to songs that all link to the theme *Rhythm and the Way we Walk*. We will also be singing and joining in with instruments.

We will create short dance sequences with a range of shapes and actions. In athletics we will be developing our running, throwing and jumping skills.

Geography/History

We will continue to develop our understanding of the world by looking at seasonal changes and the weather as we move towards summer. We will be comparing the physical and human features of our environment and a seaside town. We will also be learning how palaeontologists look for clues in fossils to understand more about prehistoric animals.

Science
