Reading	<p>Try to read your reading books or other books from home. When reading, look for the techniques we have been using in our writing. Can you find any of the following in your book?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Fronted adverbial - Alliteration - Touching sentence 	<p>Write a review of the last book that you finished.</p>	<p>Choose a chapter from the book you are reading and create a cartoon strip showing what has happened.</p>
Writing	<p>Choose a different word each day to create an acrostic poem. Take a word and write it down the side of your page, each letter on a new line. You then come up with something to do with your word that begins with each letter.</p> <p>For example:</p> <p>W is for the wind blowing nosily through the trees</p> <p>I is for the icicles hanging from the pointed roof</p> <p>N is for the night coming early</p> <p>T is for the trees like skeletons</p> <p>E is for everyone wrapped up in jumpers</p> <p>R is for resting animals hibernating until Spring.</p> <p>Continue practicing words from the Year 4 tricky words and also practice spelling rule 1 and 2 on Spelling frame.</p> <p>https://spellingframe.co.uk/</p>	<p>Over the next few weeks, you are going to be writing a non-chronological report based around our geography topic. You will be basing your report on a county in the UK of your choice. Each week I will set you a paragraph to research and write. This week you are going to do the introduction.</p> <p>You need to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - decide on your county (it could be in England, Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland) - explain what the report will be about - include a simile, a rhetorical question and at least 3 adjectives 	<p>Try to create some 10 word stories- they should still have a beginning, middle and end. eg The girl was sad. She ran away and found dragons.</p>
